Regional Life Sciences Partners Get ARPA Grant for Market Study

Speaking of great people and sensational news, a coalition of regional community partners recently received \$50,000 in ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) dollars from the County to fund a comprehensive Spokane life sciences market study. The pandemic and changing US migration trends have brought into sharp focus the need for a highly

accurate regional inventory of the key components that attract capital, talent, and skilled industry partners.

Although neither a first- nor arguably second-tier life sciences cluster —Spokane is a significant and growing tertiary market with many of the assets needed to become a nationally-recognized life sciences hub. This study will help the region understand how it compares to other national markets and will identify gaps and opportunities so we can continue to maximize our collective efforts.

The above study will build on and complement the work of Spokane's <u>Evergreen Bioscience Innovation Cluster</u> initiative. Evergreen aims to make Washington State and the Intermountain Northwest a magnet for bioscience.

Evergreen recently received an ICAP seed grant from the Department of Commerce to help establish the membership-based organization. Katrina Rogers, Evergreen's CEO, states, "The purpose of the Cluster is to foster collaboration and networking between entrepreneurs, VC/capital, corporations, government, and academia. Our early focus will be on providing a common calendar, creating a private member space and directory, and other community services and products."

Rogers sees business development as critical to Evergreen's success and her team will target contract service providers needed in our area, help them relocate here, and connect them with regional companies. Also, by learning more about the missing links in our life sciences supply chain thanks to the market study, Evergreen hopes to help Spokane companies (such as Selkirk Pharma) that use contract services preserve their capital, meet milestones, and add capacity.
