Years ago, when I was a Gonzaga Prep high school student with a full load of required classes, I took a number of fine arts classes at SAS in the evenings. It was great to take a break from my studies, learn from professional artists from the Spokane community, and practice art alongside art lovers of all ages.

At the time, SAS was located on the downtown's north bank. While SAS has spent many successful intervening years in the Garland District, I am excited to see them back in a central location and within the UD!

Their new space, at 503 East 2nd Avenue, is just two blocks south of the UD Bridge South Landing.

The renovated brick warehouse building is three times larger than their old facility, has a dedicated parking lot, and allows for expanded class, gallery, and a much-needed public event space within the District.

All SAS teachers are practicing professional artists and they are excited to move into the new location that includes up to four arts classrooms that will accommodate a diversity of fine arts mediums, student ages and abilities. Long-term plans include a ceramics classroom and private studio rentals for local artists.
