Placemaking, a buzzword used often in urban development, is ideally a way to capitalize on and celebrate a local community's assets, history, and potential. Public art is a central component of placemaking.

Here in the UD, we are starting to see more and more private developers looking to incorporate aspects of public art into their projects. The recently completed, 139-unit, mixed-income housing project, The Warren, includes a public mural by Pullman artist, <u>Jiemei Lin</u>. The southeast corner of the building is now an eye-catching explosion of color and texture depicting scenes from a rabbit warren and the family living adjacent. The piece is a welcoming and whimsical improvement to an otherwise sterile concrete wall.



The UD is also in the process of wrapping up a series of placemaking recommendations and strategies to be presented to the UDDA Board in early November. The Placemaking Task Force met this summer and has lots of ideas, best practices, and four key strategy areas for the board to consider.

- Work to increase foot traffic throughout the District;
- Create destination(s) for Spokane area citizens, students, and visitors;
- Work to develop parks, cultivate open space, and celebrate the natural environment; and
- Celebrate and honor the people, place, and existing built environment within the District.

Tirado sees the new mural as a bridge between culture and medicine. She aims for the piece to be "inspired by the Spokane community," and plans to honor the responses she received at the workshop around community "health, healing, and wellness".
