


We are thrilled to welcome AHANA (Asian, Hispanic, African, Native American) a multi-ethnic business association, to the UD as a business and property owner!

In partnership with Spokane County, in 2022 AHANA received a \$1 million allocation from the federal American Rescue Plan Act. They are now accepting applications from local nonprofits to disburse an additional \$300,000 as a part of this allocation. <u>Grant applications are due April 30</u>. This competitive grant will support recovery and rebuilding for local nonprofits whose missions support the interdependence and partnership between our business community and local workforce.

AHANA's mission and work supporting under-served and underrepresented business start-ups and workforce aligns with our U Vision 2044. The UD looks forward to future partnerships with AHANA to build a thriving and prosperous district for all.

Join us in congratulating Bill Bouten, CEO of Bouten Construction, who retires in June after 40 years in construction and project management; as well as Bouten Construction as it celebrates its 80th anniversary this month.

As the CEO since 2022, Bill has been committed to maintaining the company's legacy of exemplary client service, innovation, safety, and community involvement. Bill has served on the UDDA Board since 2019.

Bill began his career in 1984 as a project engineer at HENSEL PHELPS.
